While he was in prison, Kerri says, “My dad signed us up for Angel Tree Christmas.” She and her siblings received Christmas gifts. That opened up the opportunity to go to an Angel Tree camp.



Kerri was 5 years old the first time she went to an Angel Tree camp.

Initially, being there was tough.

“I was apparently a very shy kid,” she says. “I didn’t smile a lot. The director of worship of the camp says that I was always next to his side holding his hand, making sure that he was with me.”

Because she was shy, Kerri didn’t talk much. She remembers that her

counselors would just sit with her instead of trying to make her talk.

“They showed me love and support and they came down and met me at the level that I was at,” Kerri says. “They showed up year after year. That was a big thing.”

### CONNECTING WITH COUNSELORS & CAMPERS

Some of Kerri’s counselors also planned activities at other times of the year to connect with her and other campers. She says, “We called them Angel Tree Fun Nights.”

In addition to camp providing a break from her family, Kerri found a strong connection at camp that she didn't feel anywhere else.

"When you're at school, not everyone is like you," Kerri reflects. But at Angel Tree camp, she says, "All of those kids were like you. They've all gone through something similar. That was just such an easy way to make friends."

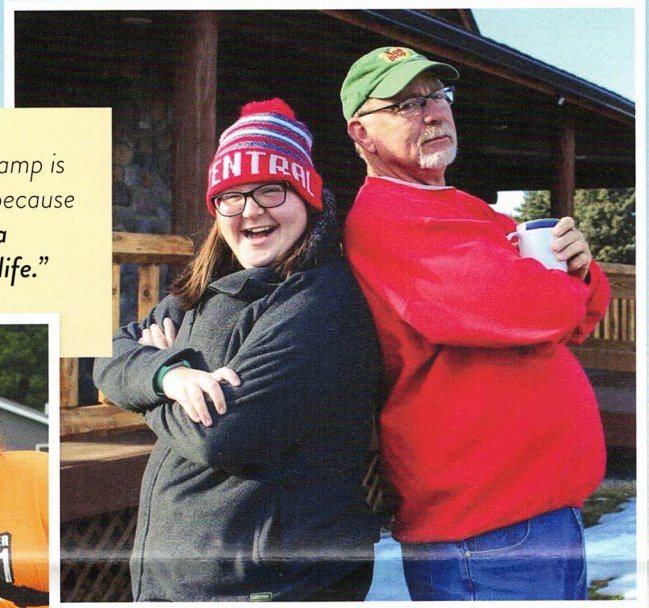
"If it wasn't for camp, then I would not be the person that I am and I wouldn't be where I am today for sure," Kerri says. "It changed my life 100%. I think if it wasn't for camp, then I wouldn't have that foundation of Christ."

After Kerri said yes to Jesus, her foundation was strengthened as her counselors poured into her beyond the week of camp.

"I had counselors who would call me once a week and say, 'Hey, what have you been reading in the Word this week? What have you been doing that's honoring Christ this week?' I had those mentors that held me accountable," Kerri shares.

She went to Angel Tree camp through high school and then came back as a counselor.

Today, as a young adult, Kerri works in special education at a high school and continues to be very active with her local Angel Tree camp.

"In the past three summers, I've been transitioning more into Angel Tree leadership," Kerri says.

Because of the powerful impact on her own life, Kerri can't stop talking about Angel Tree camping.

"It's an incredible ministry," she says. "It gives you an opportunity to change a kid's life—not just one time but forever."

Her hope for the future is to do just that. Kerri says, "Just blessing kids in the ways that I was blessed and changing their lives in the ways that my life was changed."

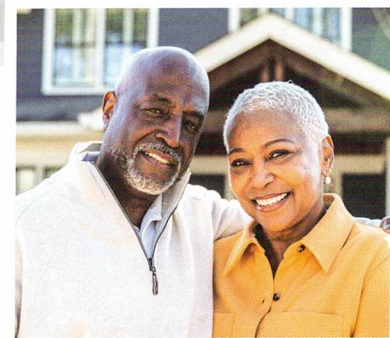

Dear Friends,

*“When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them” (Acts 2:1-4 NIV).*

At that first Pentecost, the disciples were gathered in one place in Jerusalem when the Spirit of God came like a violent wind and fell upon the disciples like tongues of fire! According to Acts 2:3, those flaming licks separated and *rested on each of the disciples*. They were filled with the Spirit and exercised their gift, declaring the wonders of God in various languages as the Spirit enabled them—words that their listeners from around the world all heard and understood in their native tongues (Acts 2:5-11).

Isn't it amazing that the Spirit anoints and equips God's people *individually*? The fire of God didn't just run roughshod, willy-nilly, over the disciples. I recall a grassfire in Colorado Springs in April 2022 that came within a hundred yards of my home, forcing us to temporarily evacuate. I don't recall the fire discriminating between individual blades of grass that afternoon; it simply razed the entire area in mere seconds. But the Acts 2 account suggests that the Holy Spirit doesn't act indiscriminately as if He were instigating an impulsive and unruly mob. Instead, He anoints diverse individuals and enables each to do the good works which God has prepared in advance for them—and, crucially, according to how the Spirit has gifted and wired them. Just as no two fingerprints are alike, the Spirit works through each of us differently to God's glory!

Two very different Spirit-filled individuals come to mind. The first is “D,” a former international student whom I got to know and study God's word with when he and I were in Phoenix over two decades ago. “D” was a quiet and shy—and, by all accounts, rather average—young man. However, in contrast to his considerably more gifted and talented peers—internationals whom I'd assume would become big-time movers and shakers in the Kingdom of God—it is “D” today who, in his meek and unobtrusive way, plays a pivotal role as a very effective witness and disciple-maker for Christ in his home country!

The second is “J,” an international cadet at the US Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs and a regular visitor to my home. A senior who will graduate from the Academy this May, “J” has distinguished himself as the second-highest ranking cadet (no mean feat for a foreign student!) and a highly influential Christian leader amongst his fellow cadets at the Academy. Primed to return home this May and serve his nation as a fighter pilot and military leader, “J” is set to rise to the highest levels of his nation’s armed forces and whose spiritual impact is likely to be global in kind!

Two highly distinct internationals— “D” is mild-mannered and introverted, whereas “J” is a force of nature—but both have been powerfully anointed and appointed by the Spirit of God for divine purposes. At Pentecost, the Spirit anointed and ministered to the disciples individually. He continues to do likewise with us!

## Keep Praying for That Unsaved Spouse!

A lady from the Bible study was praying a long time for her husband's salvation. Then one day, the husband, a 37-year-old public school teacher and school zone supervisor, sought out **Arturo & Silvia Tomé** (Mexico), wanting to talk about God. He said that he wanted to believe in God but didn't know how. Arturo shared the gospel with him while Silvia prayed in the room next door. And the Lord saved him!

The transformation was obvious! He organized a Bible study with five school teachers. Having introduced the Tomés as children's Bible teachers, seven schools asked them to tell of the birth of Jesus using puppets during the Christmas season. The Lord is working among the teachers. The Tomés are praying that God will save the teachers who in turn will lead many children to Christ Jesus!

## A Needle in a Haystack

In an unreached country like Japan, finding a Japanese person who is open to the gospel is like finding a needle in a haystack. But God is at work!

Since losing her husband a year ago, a Japanese woman was struggling with loneliness. Then she discovered the English Café hosted by **Johan & Haruko Strydom**, and she has become a regular attendee. Because of her relationship with the Strydoms, she is willing to visit the church that they are planting, Osaka International Baptist Church. Although she is not a follower of Christ, she attends many Sundays. After each service, she joyfully shares the teaching about God that she learned! Now they long to see her trust in Christ for salvation.

## One Step at a Time

The lady joined Rebecca's neighborhood early morning walking group while going through postpartum depression. When spiritual topics arose, she stiffened and became quiet. When invited to the Friday women's Bible study, she said that she visits her mom that day.

The friendship deepened. She decided to visit her family on Thursdays so that she could attend the study. The ladies of the group instantly welcomed her, and she became a regular attendee.

When **Frank & Rebecca Arellanes** (Mexico) offered marriage classes, she and her atheist husband showed up. He attended faithfully and participated enthusiastically, interjecting colorful language in his answers.

Rebecca began discipling the wife, and after a few months, she gave her life to Christ. They were at church the next Sunday. The husband resisted meeting with Frank, saying that there were too many things in his life that he'd have to change if he surrendered to Jesus. Their 10-year old son put his faith in Christ. Finally the husband trusted Christ, and the three were baptized together!

One year later, the wife is discipling two ladies, and the husband is an integral part of the men's group at church.

## The Prayers of Children

At a missionary children's school in Mexico, the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> grades, taught by **Kathy Stucky**, have been praying for a local 5-year-old boy. His father's job took him away from the family. The

boy missed his dad so much that he refused to talk. At Christmas, the father came home and applied for jobs close to home. Kathy's class prayed that the father would get a job and that the little boy would come to know Jesus as his Savior.

Valentine's Day in Mexico is a friendship day. Kathy's class focused on God's love for them and their love for God and others. For an activity, they made a big card, telling the boy that they are praying that his dad will get a job and telling him that God loves him. At the end of February, the father got the job! Now the class is praying for their salvation!



## Reproducing Disciples

A Togolese pastor heard about the reproducible discipleship training that **Justin & Rachel Hoy** and their team were leading in Senegal and asked them to come to Togo to teach his seminary students and the regional pastors' association. Justin and Fiacre, his ministry partner, made several trips to Togo in 2022 training them how to make disciples who in turn make disciples.

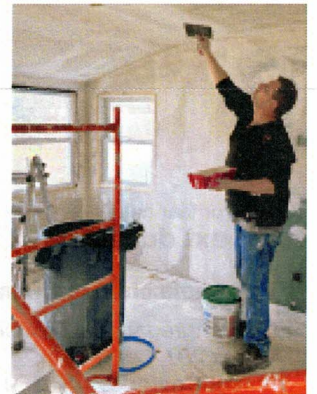
Although the pastor is a seminary professor, he showed great humility learning this new strategy. Afterward, he immediately implemented the program. The fruit of their labor was evident in 2023. Along with his team of discipleship trainers, they reported 1,080 new believers, 140 baptisms, and 19 new churches!

## Renovating Homes, Restoring Lives

Renovating homes aligns well with ministry to the homeless, drug addicts, and formerly incarcerated men. They learn employable skills in addition to character building. But it's challenging.

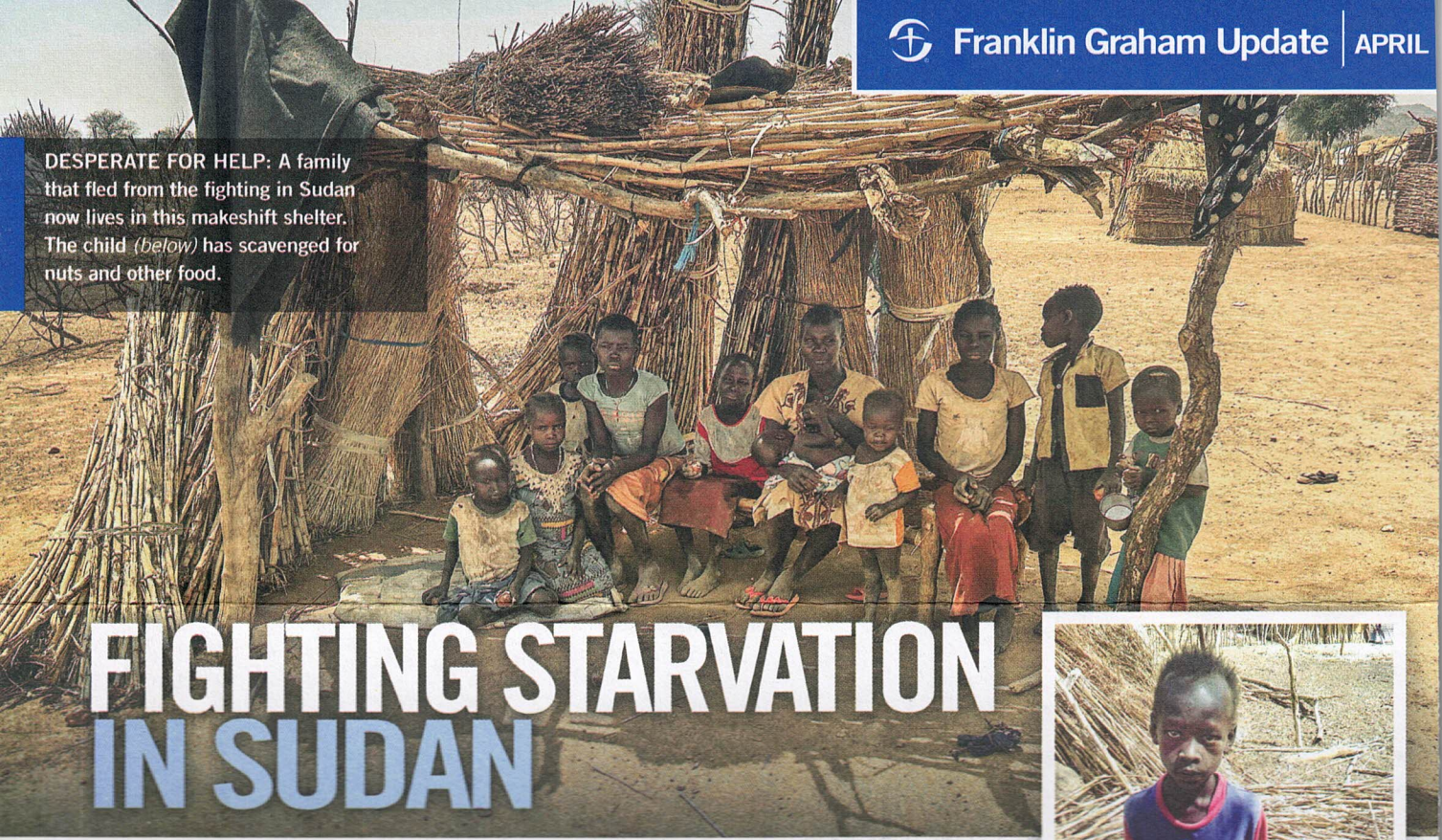

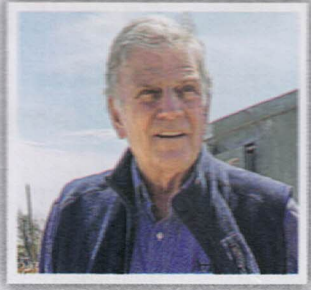
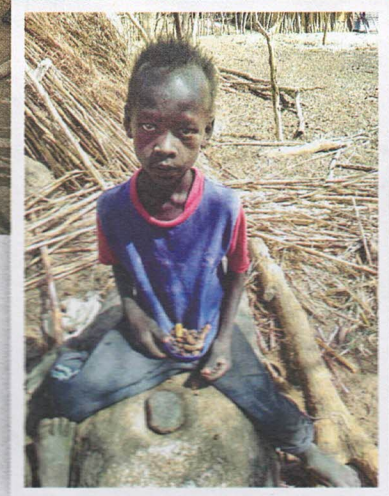

# FIGHTING STARVATION IN SUDAN



**DEAR FRIEND,**

It's been a year since war erupted in Sudan, turning the capital city of Khartoum into a battlefield and uprooting almost half of the nation's population.

Millions have fled into remote corners of the country, including about 700,000 who poured into a region known as Kordofan, where Samaritan's Purse

has been working for years. I've been there, and I've seen how farmers struggle to raise enough crops to feed their families, much less to deal with a wave of desperate and hungry exiles who have built huts out of nothing but sticks.

Then at the worst of times, a plague of locusts devoured fields of sorghum, the crop that sustains this part of Sudan. Now, people are so hungry that they are boiling leaves and foraging weeds.

We thank God for preparing the way for Samaritan's Purse to help. We have organized a series of convoys, each with 16 trucks, that will deliver enough corn, salt, and cooking oil to feed tens of thousands of people for three months. These shipments include specially formulated peanut paste to care for malnourished children.

We need to work quickly, because the rainy season is coming, which will make the unpaved roads of Sudan impassable. There's no time to waste!

Kordofan is near the Nile River and the border with South Sudan, which gained independence in 2011 after decades of civil war. Samaritan's Purse has worked there to rebuild churches and train pastors, and now we're working there in Jesus' Name to meet emergency needs.

Please pray for the people of Sudan, and ask the Lord to use our help to show them how much He loves them.

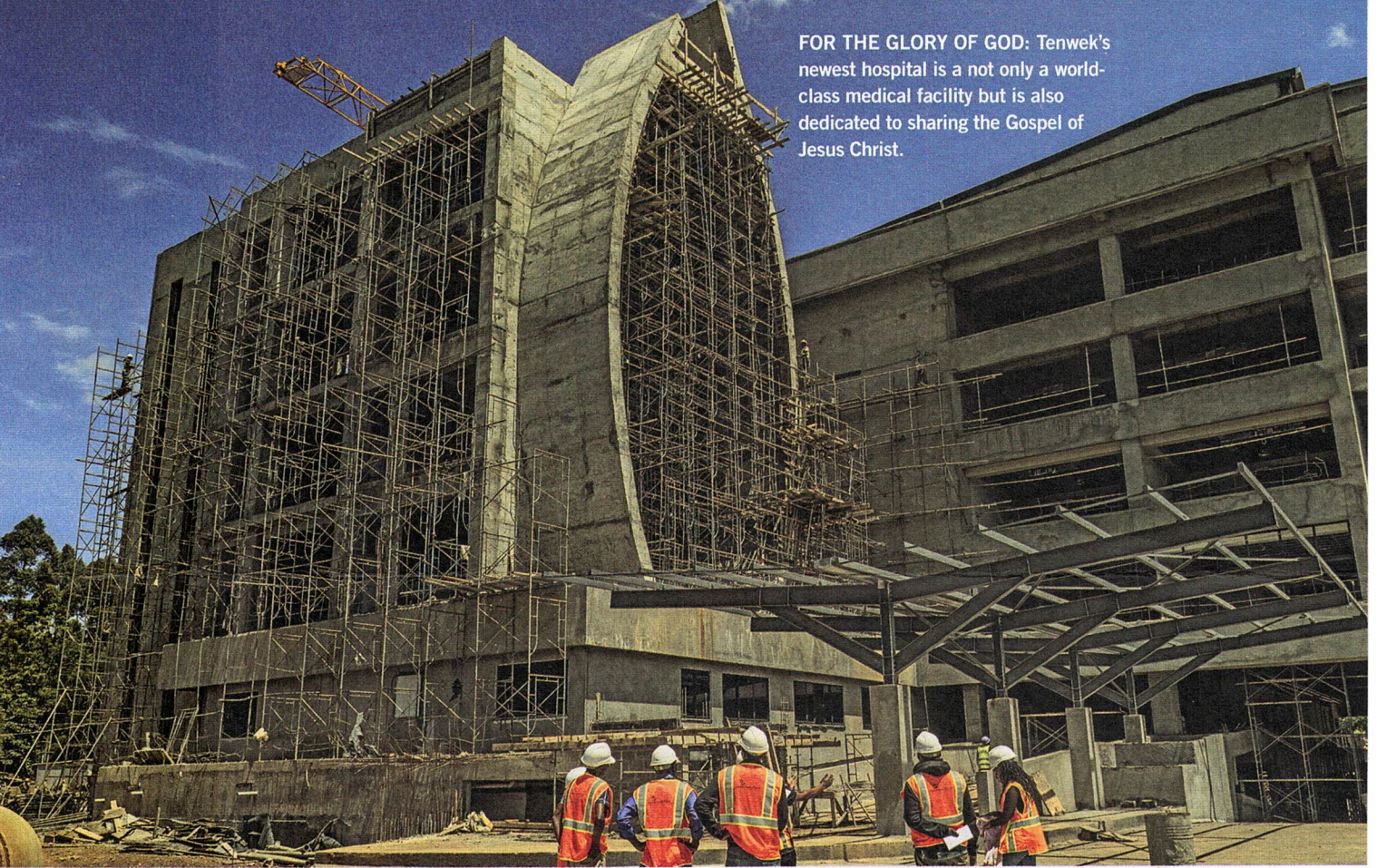


## **World-Class Mission Hospital Rises Out of Kenya's Rift Valley**

Back in 1978, Dr. Lowell Furman and I traveled to Kenya's Rift Valley to visit Tenwek Hospital, which was so overcrowded that we saw three patients sharing every bed. Samaritan's Purse promised to build new wards, which was a milestone project in the early history of our ministry, as the Lord demonstrated His faithfulness.

Decades later, Samaritan's Purse is helping to build a state-of-the-art hospital that will serve patients from all across Africa.

FOR THE GLORY OF GOD: Tenwek's newest hospital is not only a world-class medical facility but is also dedicated to sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ.



The Tenwek Cardiothoracic Center will be the premier hospital of its kind on the African continent and will be dedicated to the glory of God. *“Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven”* (Matthew 5:16).

Dr. Arega Leta came from Ethiopia to Tenwek to train as a surgeon and now serves on the staff. “When I first came here, heart surgery was something that was never dreamt about,” she said. “No one would think that a small, rural-based mission hospital would do heart surgery, let alone open-heart surgery. But through multiple confirmations, it became clear that this is what God wanted us to do.”

The one thing that has never changed at Tenwek is its slogan: “We Treat, Jesus Heals.” Chaplains visit patients daily, and hundreds each year trust Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. Tenwek is the model for a chaplaincy training program that we’ve implemented in dozens of mission hospitals worldwide.

Lowell Furman and his brother, Dick, were co-founders of World Medical Mission, the medical arm of Samaritan’s Purse. Dick Furman believes the new hospital is only the beginning of what God has in store for Tenwek. He quoted one of my father’s favorite verses: *“Being confident of this very thing, that He who has begun a good work in you will complete it until the day of Jesus Christ”* (Philippians 1:6).

# Online Evangelists

## Dear Friends,

Where do young people gather today?

Jesus wasn't content to just share the good news in synagogues and homes—he boldly proclaimed the gospel in the streets, fields, and squares where large crowds gathered. Today's young people are in the midst of global change that is taking them online and into social media through their smartphones. They spend an average of 6 hours a day in this digital world.

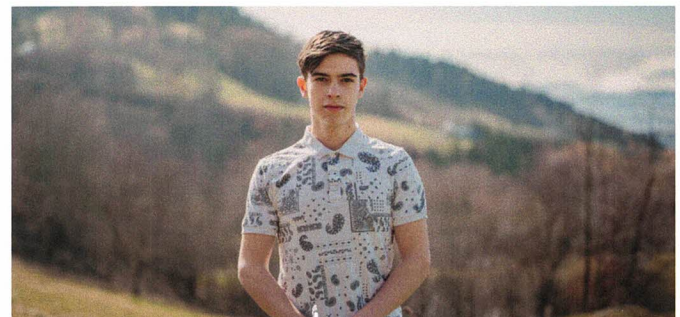


Alex put his faith in Jesus as a 14-year-old and immediately began to devour the Word of God for 3-4 hours a day. There are few evangelical believers in Serbia, where he lives, and he noticed all his friends were spending most of their time-consuming media from their phones. Knowing they were not hearing the gospel in those places, at 15 years of age, he decided to record a short Bible message with a challenge and post it on TikTok.

With only an old Android phone propped up on an orange and no special equipment, he passionately spoke into the camera. A few hours later he checked his post and found there were only five views. Later that day, there were a few more. The one that caught his attention most, however, was a message left by one of Serbia's most prominent TikTokers, who had randomly come across his feed. The note was full of scorn and ridicule, telling him he was stupid and incompetent and that the message he was giving was worthless.

Discouraged, Alex put his phone away and decided this was not a good idea. But a week later, he checked, and there were over 1000 views. Encouraged by the response, Alex posted another passionate message about Jesus and then another. To his surprise, the unique nature of his bold proclamation attracted controversy—and with it,

many viewings. The numbers on his original video climbed to 28,000. Some of his later messages reached an astounding 154,000 views in a country with only 8,000 evangelical believers.



Realizing that seeing something on the screen is only the first step, Alex offered to send free Bibles to those interested in learning more about Jesus. Last month, he mailed 300 Bibles to people who wrote to him from across Serbia. Watching their response gave him another idea: to announce to his digital audience that he was setting up a book table in the city, inviting them to come and purchase books about the Bible and about God. His bold experiment worked, and the small book table resulted in many conversations, as well as getting books into the hands of searching people.

Our JV Serbia team heard of Alex's work and began mentoring and discipling him as an online evangelist. Last month, he joined 35 other young leaders like him from eight countries that we gathered for our first-ever Digital Missions Summit. This small group of online evangelists has an audience of over 1 million followers and are boldly teaching God's Word and sharing the gospel with their peers through the channels of YouTube, Facebook, and TikTok.

Once again, Jesus is entering the public square—this time through the voices of his young followers. Thanks for making this possible through your support and prayers.

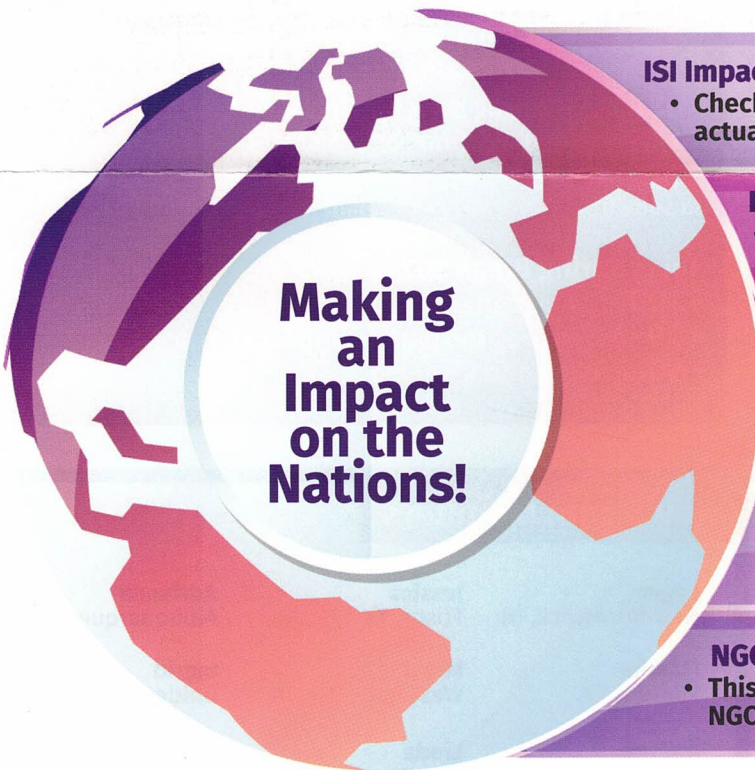


## Message from President Seng Tan

It's an exciting time for ISI! Just as God promised in Isaiah 54:2, He is expanding our "tent" through extending our reach within America and beyond, while lengthening our "tent cords" and strengthening its "stakes" through systematic discipling, equipping, and care of our students, staff, and volunteers. But with growth comes a host of challenges, including failing to keep our eyes on what truly matters.

The Bible refers to another tent—the Tent of Meeting—where Moses and his leaders would meet with God during their wilderness trek. Exodus 33:7 describes the location of this tent of God's Presence as pitched some distance away from the Israelite camp, outside of it. However, by the time we get to Numbers 2, the Israelites had moved the tent to the center of their camp; when they marched, the tent sat in the middle of their order of battle (v. 17).
